Thank you Bert, we are going to miss you.



Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify the inhabitants of the Town of Kenduskeag, County of Penobscot, qualified by law to vote in said Town's affairs, to assemble at the Town Office, in said Town of Kenduskeag on Thursday March 28, 2024 to vote by secret ballot, for the Election of Officers and consideration of articles 1 thru 2 of this Annual Town Meeting Warrant. Polls shall open at 10:00 am and close at 6:00 pm.

And to notify the voters to assemble at the Municipal Building in said Town of Kenduskeag at 7:00 pm on Friday, March 29, 2024, for the Annual Town Meeting, and then and there to act on articles 3 thru 38 of this warrant.

Article 1. To elect a Moderator to preside at said Annual Town Meeting.

Article 2. To elect by secret ballot, a Selectman for a three (3) year term, an Assessor for a three (3) year term, an Overseer of the Poor for a three (3) year term and a M.S.A.D. #64 Director for a three (3) year term.

Article 3. To elect two (2) Budget Advisory Committee Members for three (3) year terms.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to elect two (2) Library Board Trustees for one (3) year terms.

Article 5. To elect a Cemetery Sexton for a one (1) year term.

Article 6. To see if the Town will Raise and Appropriate \$114,050 for General Administration Salaries as follows:

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to fix a date when taxes are due and payable, and to see if the Town will fix a rate of interest on taxes unpaid after said date. (Recommended: Taxes shall be due and payable on October 1, 2024, and that interest shall be charged at the rate of 8.5% per annum from October 2, 2024)

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to accept donations by individuals and organizations to be used as specified.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate from 2024 taxes to pay for tax abatements.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to sell or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes, and to execute Quit-Claim Deeds for said property. If the sale of said property is to persons other than the original owner or members of his/her family, the sale shall be by sealed bids, with prior notice given to the general public.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to accept grants from State and Federal Agencies, to be used as specified in the grants.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer on behalf of the Town, to transfer monies from Trust & Reserve Funds to the General Fund, in anticipation of real estate taxes. To be returned on or before December 31, 2024.

Article 34. To see if the Town will authorize the Tax Collector to accept pre-payments of real estate taxes.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12 of the 2024 Annual Budget during the period from January 1, 2025 to the 2025 Annual Town Meeting.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell, or otherwise dispose of, excess vehicles and equipment, and deposit any proceeds into the appropriate department's account.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize within the municipality the operation of medical cannabis registered caregiver retail stores, provided they operate in compliance with all applicable state and local requirements?

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a flag that was designed by Gabrielle Weeks, as the Town of Kenduskeag Official Flag?

The Registrar of Voters will hold office hours while the polls are open to correct any errors or change of name or address on the voting list, and to accept any new enrollments only. Any person who is not a registered voter may not vote in any election.

CEMETERY ASSOCIATION REPORT

Kenduskeag Cemetery Association has been busy and have accomplished a lot. Several dedicated members have cleaned several stones this year. We thank them for the devotion of their precious time.

Several large trees were removed, and part of the fence was painted. Next year we hope to remove and grind the tree stumps.

Cleanup Day was done in the spring with Kenduskeag Girls Scouts and members of the Kenduskeag Masonic Lodge #137. Flags and medallions were placed at each veterans' lot with a salute and recognition of their name thanking them for their service. It is a privilege to be able to honor each one of them.

A plaque has also been installed in the Village Cemetery. This states that the original stones that were damaged from the vehicle accident of two years ago have been replaced with new stones and that the fragments left, have been retained in the Cemetery. Plans are also for next year to erect a board for the World War I Veterans. Flowers were also planted around the flagpole, cannon, and veterans' monuments.

Plans are also to move the fence toward the Rozelle Farm a short distance on land that the town already owns per discussion with the Selectmen of Kenduskeag to make more lots available. Next year's plans are also to pave a small area at each entrance of the roads to prevent further damage from erosion.

Greeting's,

As we enter 2024 we'd like to say thank you to our town's citizens and the selectboard for their support through the past year. We also want to thank our members for their continued dedication to serving our community. In 2023 Kenduskeag Fire-Rescue was dispatched to 229 Calls for service 144 EMS and 85 Fire.

In 2023 we accomplished a big project focused on CPR and cardiac care including the purchase of a cardiac monitor and ARM mechanical cpr device. We also were able to purchase an AED for the town office and recreation field. We are hoping to purchase one more AED in 2024 for the Case memorial library. The majority of this was funded through a grant from the Stephen and Tabitha King foundation.

Large goals for 2024 include seeking additional grant funding for much needed equipment upgrades. We will specifically be focusing on replacing our self contained breathing apparatus or SCBA's. The total cost of replacement is around \$90,000. Some of our SCBA's date as far back as 1998 and parts are becoming hard to find. We've applied for grant funding through Gloria C. MacKenzie foundation for this project and are hopeful we will be approved for the next round of the process after April 15th.

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to serve the people of Maine in the U.S. Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share an update on issues important to Maine and America.

One of my priorities for 2023 has been to improve the appropriations process in Congress – the way it decides how to spend taxpayer money. I took over as the Vice Chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee last year. Along with Chair Patty Murray, we decided the best change we could make was not to do something new. Instead, it was to do something old – that is, go back to the regular and transparent committee process that we used to have.

Part of restoring this process included holding 50 public Committee hearings, which allowed for input from senators on both sides of the aisle. As a result, for the first time in five years, the Senate Appropriations Committee passed all twelve of its funding bills on time. This was done with strong bipartisan support. In fact, seven of them passed unanimously.

Now, we need to work with the House of Representatives to pass these twelve bills and turn them into laws.

These bills contain funding for a wide range of Maine priorities, including support for the workforce at Bath Iron Works and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, our lobster industry, infrastructure improvements, affordable housing, biomedical research, veterans, and heating assistance programs like LIHEAP. These bills also contain nearly \$590 million in Congressionally Directed Spending for 231 projects throughout the State of Maine. These projects would help promote job creation, expand access to health care, and improve public safety, infrastructure, and important resources in communities across all 16 counties of our state. I will continue to work to get these bills signed into law in the new year.

On October 25, the horrific mass shooting in Lewiston claimed the lives of 18 Mainers and injured 13 others. In response, I led Maine's Congressional Delegation in requesting an independent investigation by the U.S. Army Inspector General into the events leading up to the shooting. On December 15, the Under Secretary of the Army wrote to inform me that such an investigation will take place, and the Army Inspector General has instructed her team to immediately begin preparing to conduct this investigation. While nothing can undo the events of October 25, I will continue to work to understand what happened and what could have been done differently, and to find answers for the victims, survivors, and their families.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and this year I honored that work ethic when I cast my 8,855th consecutive roll call vote.

As we look ahead to 2024, I remain committed to addressing the concerns of Maine families and communities. If you need assistance or wish to share your thoughts, please do not hesitate to reach out to one of my six state offices.

Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you safe and well. It's an honor to continue serving as your representative in Congress, and I take the responsibility very seriously. I appreciate the opportunity to update you on what I've been working on behalf of the people of the Second Congressional District.

Maine's heritage industries are the backbone of our state's economy. That is why one of the first bills I introduced in this Congress was the *Northeast Fisheries Heritage Protection Act*, which would prohibit commercial offshore wind energy development in Lobster Management Area 1 (LMA 1) in the Gulf of Maine. LMA 1 was identified by the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) as a potential commercial offshore wind site. LMA 1 is a critical and highly productive fishing ground for a variety of sea life, including lobster. Prohibiting offshore wind development in LMA 1 would help to avoid conflict with the New England commercial and recreational fishing industries. Additionally, the bill would initiate a federal study on the environmental review processes of any relevant Federal agencies for offshore wind projects in the Gulf of Maine.

I also continue to advocate on behalf of our veterans and those providing care to our former service members. The current pay for VA employees in the Kennebec and Penobscot counties does not reflect the critical services they are providing. As the oldest state in the nation, with the fifth highest veteran population, Mainers rely on the services offered at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities. That's why recently, Senator Collins, Senator King, Representative Pingree, and I called on the Biden Administration to increase locality pay for VA employees in Kennebec and Penobscot counties. The level of care received is impacted by job vacancies, and the high turnover rate among its healthcare workforce is often the result of pay and compensation issues, which is further exacerbated by the increased cost of living.

Lastly, I'm excited that Mainers are continuing to reap the benefits of the *Bipartisan Infrastructure Law* (BIL). Recently, millions of dollars in grants have been awarded across the state, including \$35 million through the U.S. Department of Transportation's Culvert Aquatic Organism Passage (AOP) program to conserve spawning and migratory habitats for native fish species in Maine, \$460,000 through the Airport Infrastructure Grant (AIG) program for the Princeton Municipal Airport, Stephen A. Bean Municipal Airport, and Dexter Regional Airport, and nearly \$8 million through the Buses and Bus Facilities Program for Bangor's bus system. These investments are critical to ensuring Maine's infrastructure and will help to ensure Mainers and businesses across Maine are connected.

Regardless of the year, one of my top priorities is ensuring I'm accessible to you. My staff and I can help answer questions about and navigate federal programs; find resources in Maine; and resolve issues with Medicare, Social Security, the VA, and other federal agencies and programs. Dear Friends and Neighbors:

I want to thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve you in the Maine Senate. It has been an honor to work on your behalf to make our state an even better place to live, work, and conduct business. I am grateful you have put your trust in me, and I will continue to work tirelessly on behalf of the people of Senate District 4.

The First Regular and First Special Sessions of the 131st Maine State Legislature were notable as there were over 2,600 legislative bill requests and 2,019 of them were officially printed as Legislative Documents (LDs). No legislature this century has had as many LDs printed during its first year.

One area of success was in the Highway Fund. In the past, the Highway Fund has been supported through gasoline taxes, which have been declining for years due to more fuel-efficient and electric/hybrid vehicles, and bonding. However, we now have created a sustainable source of funding to maintain our transportation infrastructure. Independent Auditors' Report

To the Select Board Town of Kenduskeag Kenduskeag, Maine

OPINIONS

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of Town of Kenduskeag, Maine, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine, as of December 31, 2023, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

BASIS FOR OPINIONS

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's ability to continue as a going concern for twelve months beyond the financial statement date, including any currently known information that may raise substantial doubt shortly thereafter.

AUDITOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on financial statements.

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In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that
 are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the
 effectiveness of Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that
 raise substantial doubt about Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's ability to continue as a going concern for a
 reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

REQUIRED SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis, schedule of changes in net OPEB liability and related ratios, and budgetary comparison schedule, on pages 5-9, 27, and 28 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's basic financial statements. The combining nonmajor fund financial statements, schedule of property valuation, assessments, and appropriations, schedule of taxes receivable and schedule of departmental operations are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and related directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the combining nonmajor financial statements, schedule of property valuation, assessments, and appropriations, schedule of taxes receivable and schedule of departmental operations are fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.
