

TO: Elena Reed, Town of Kenduskeag, in said County...

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify the inhabitants of the Town of Kenduskeag, County of Penobscot, qualified by law to vote in said Town's affairs, to assemble at the Town Office, in said Town of Kenduskeag on Thursday March 26, 2026 to vote by secret ballot, for the Election of Officers and consideration of articles 1 thru 2 of this Annual Town Meeting Warrant. Polls shall open at 9:00 am and close at 8:00 pm.

And to notify the voters to assemble at the Municipal Building in said Town of Kenduskeag at 7:00 pm on Friday, March 27, 2026 for the Annual Town Meeting, and then and there to act on articles thru 35 of this warrant.

Article 1. To elect a Moderator to preside at said Annual Town Meeting.

Article 2. To elect by secret ballot, a Selectman for a three (3) year term, an Assessor for a three (3) year term, an Overseer of the Poor for a three (3) year term, a M.S.A.D. #64 Director for a three (3) year term.

Article 3. To elect two (1) Budget Advisory Committee Members for three (3) year terms and one (1) member for a one (1) year term.

Article 4. To elect Two Planning Board Members for three-year terms

Article 5. To elect a Cemetery Sexton for a one (1) year term.

Article 6. To see if the Town will Raise and Appropriate \$124,650 for General Administration Salaries as follows:

Planning Board & CEO:	\$6,000

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate \$20,000 for Administrative Expenses.
(Recommended by Selectmen & Budget Committee)

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate \$576 received from the registration of snowmobiles, to the Kenduskeag Stream Riders Snowmobile Club, for the purpose of maintaining their trails, to always be open to the public for the purpose of snowmobiling.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply those monies received from the U. S. Postal Service towards the expenses and maintenance of the Municipal Buildings.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate \$6,100 for Animal Control.
(Recommended by Selectmen & Budget Committee)

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to allow The Recreation Committee to spend, upon approval of the Selectmen, any amount raised by fundraising in addition to their regular recreation budget.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate \$61,000 for Insurance Services as follows:

 Payroll Tax & Insurance: \$60,500
 Contingency Fund: \$10,000

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to increase the tax levy limit of \$190,656 established for the Town of Kenduskeag by State Law, in the event that the municipal budget approved under the preceding articles will result in a tax commitment that is greater than that property tax levy limit.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to fund Articles 6 through 22 of this warrant by Appropriating the follow amounts:

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to fix a date when taxes are due and payable, and to see if the Town will fix a rate of interest on taxes unpaid after said date. (Recommended: Taxes shall be due and payable on October 1, 2025, and that interest shall be charged at the rate of 9% per annum from October 2, 2025)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to accept donations by individuals and organizations to be used as specified.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate from 2025 taxes to pay for tax abatements.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to sell or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes, and to execute Quit-Claim Deeds for said property. If the sale of said property is to persons other than the original owner or members of his/her family, the sale shall be by sealed bids, with prior notice given to the general public.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept grants from State and Federal Agencies, to be used as specified in the grants.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer on behalf of the Town, to transfer monies from Trust & Reserve Funds to the General Fund, in anticipation of real estate taxes. To be returned on or before December 31, 2025.

Article 26. To see if the Town will authorize the Tax Collector to accept pre-payments of real estate taxes.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12 of the 2025 Annual Budget during the period from January 1, 2025 to the 2025 Annual Town Meeting.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell, or otherwise dispose of, excess vehicles and equipment, and deposit any proceeds into the appropriate department's account.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to raise an appropriate \$200,000 for Fire Department payroll and Expenditures and Ambulance Transportation.
(Recommended by Selectmen & Budget Committee)

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to adopt Fire and Rescue Cost Recovery Ordinance to authorize the billing of insurance companies and individuals for costs associated with emergency services.

The Registrar of Voters will hold office hours while the polls are open to correct any errors or change of name or address on the voting list, and to accept any new enrollments only. Any person who is not a registered voter may not vote in any election.

I am pleased to present the Code Enforcement report for 2025.

Reflecting on this past year, 2025 was a year of modest and measured growth for construction and development within the town. A total of 20 building permits were issued, and 12 plumbing permits were issued, demonstrating a gradual level of growth and investment in the community. Here is a breakdown of the permits issued:

 - - 6 sheds
 - - 5 solar installations

Dear Friends,

It is an honor to serve the people of Maine, and I welcome this opportunity to update you on the work that has taken place in the Senate over the past year. My staff and I have addressed numerous issues affecting our state, and I would like to share some of the progress that we have made.

Since my *Social Security Fairness Act* was signed into law in January 2025, the law has been fully implemented and restored earned retirement benefits to 2.8 million Americans. More than 25,000 Mainers have seen their monthly benefits increase and have been issued more than \$184.5 million in retroactive payments. I am proud that this legislation has improved the lives of many retired firefighters, teachers, police officers, and other public employees and their spouses.

I was honored to become the first Maine Senator in nearly a century to lead the Appropriations Committee. Since I took this role last January, Congress enacted full-year appropriations bills before December for the first time since 2018. These bipartisan bills included full-year funding for Military Construction and the Department of Veterans Affairs, the US Department of Agriculture, and the Food and Drug Administration. At my request, these bills included nearly \$35 million in Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) for local projects across Maine that will improve fire stations and emergency services, update municipal buildings, and support upgraded facilities at the Maine National Guard and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard (PNSY) in Kittery. This funding builds on the nearly \$1.1 billion in CDS I have secured since 2021 for worthy projects that benefit local communities and nonprofits across 16 counties. As Chair, I remain committed to working to better ensure that federal spending and investments produce real results for the people of Maine.

I have also led other important legislative efforts this year that address problems many Mainers face. This includes bills that expand federal efforts to combat Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses and improve access to early testing for Alzheimer's disease. Provisions I authored to strengthen prevention, treatment, and recovery services for those struggling with substance use disorders and mental illness were included in the *SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Reauthorization Act* that was recently signed into law. An amendment I authored in this year's *National Defense Authorization Act* will increase apprenticeship opportunities at public shipyards like PNSY. That bill also includes more than \$400 million to support critical infrastructure improvements at PNSY and a well-deserved 3.8 percent pay raise for all our nation's service members.

In addition to advancing legislation, I worked to ensure that federal commitments to Maine were maintained and, when necessary, restored. I secured a seasonal employee exemption for Acadia National Park from the Administration's federal hiring freeze and from closure during the recent government shutdown. I protected local programs like Maine Sea Grant and global initiatives like the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) from harmful funding cuts. I led the effort to resume enrollment at Maine Job Corps centers and fought for full funding for Maine's public schools this school year. I preserved funding for the University of Maine System and secured the restoration of funding to the Passamaquoddy Tribe at Pleasant Point and the Penobscot Nation. I protected low-income Mainers' access to key programs like LIHEAP and SNAP. Although I voted against the *One Big Beautiful Bill Act* due to my opposition to Medicaid cuts, I helped secure \$50 billion to support rural health providers through the legislation's Rural Health Transformation Program. Maine has been awarded \$190 million in the first year of this five-year grant program.

Throughout my Senate service, I have never missed a roll-call vote and have cast more than 9,850 consecutive votes—reflecting the Maine work ethic I bring to Washington. My continued ranking as most bipartisan Senator from the Lugar Center and Georgetown University is a testament to Maine's tradition of working with cooperation and respect.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve as your State Senator. It has been an honor to work on your behalf to make our state an even better place to live, work and conduct business. I assure you, I will continue to work diligently on behalf of the people of Senate District 4.

I was officially sworn in for my fourth and final term on December 4, 2024. The 132nd Maine Legislature adjourned in July, concluding the First Regular and First Special Sessions. With 415 bills carried over to the next session, including more than 200 still pending in committees, we have a significant workload ahead when we return for the Second Regular Session in January.

I am pleased to report the Legislature passed several critical bills aimed at expanding access to medical care, including measures to improve prescription access in Maine's most rural communities. We also secured key wins to protect our vital forest and logging industries, strengthen Maine's hospitality sector, and create new economic opportunities in agriculture by supporting food processing and manufacturing incentives.

On a personal note, I am proud that two bills I sponsored were enacted into law this year. LD 550 established the Maine Experiential Education Program to support outdoor, agricultural and hands on learning in our public schools and to help schools build and sustain programs like school gardens, local food education and other real world learning experiences. LD 567 designated the second full week of May and the second full week of September as Dark Sky Week to encourage communities and schools to learn about the importance of Maine's night skies, bird migration and the need to reduce unnecessary light pollution. I am grateful to the educators, parents, students and community members who helped make these initiatives a reality.

Again, thank you for reelecting me to serve you in the State Senate. Despite many successes over the past year, lawmakers will have a lot of work to do next session. I am committed to continuing that work. I believe strongly that Maine is best served when there is better political balance in the Legislature, and I remain hopeful that such balance will allow for more cooperation and meaningful progress in the years ahead. As your State Senator, I will continue to do all I can to advocate for your priorities in Augusta.

What I've learned through our work together is that there are leaders all over Maine everywhere you look — people committed to service, to their communities and their country: Municipal officials and workers. Business owners and innovators. Servicemembers and law enforcement officers. Volunteer firefighters. And of course, the everyday workers, parents and students who are all doing their part to contribute how they can to their families and communities.

I am grateful to share this state with every single one of you, and despite all our challenges, I am optimistic about our future because of what I've seen and learned. I know that the things that divide us are no match for the things we have in common and our commitment to each other.



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE ENCLOSED

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The 132nd Legislature concluded its work for the year on June 25. Sadly, a long-standing tradition of bipartisanship on key issues, particularly the state budget, has largely eroded.

This session, the Legislature passed a new biennial budget of \$11.6 billion for fiscal years 2026–2027, a 10% increase from the previous \$10.5 billion budget for FY24–25. For context, just eight years ago in FY16–17, Maine's state budget was approximately \$6.7 billion, illustrating a dramatic and consistent rise in state spending.

Meanwhile, Mainers continue to face serious financial pressure. The rising costs of taxes, electricity, and housing are hitting working families and the middle class the hardest. While affordable housing remains out of reach for many, tens of millions in taxpayer dollars are being spent to temporarily house economic migrants, often at the expense of our own homeless population, seniors, veterans, and young people in need of stable housing.

Despite consistent calls from constituents, the Legislature again failed to meaningfully address two of the most pressing issues at the kitchen table: high electricity costs and the heavy tax burden. Soaring electric bills are not only squeezing household budgets, they are also pushing manufacturing jobs out of state, threatening Maine's long-term economic vitality.

Even so, I'm encouraged by the growing public engagement from citizens across our state. When people raise their voices and hold their leaders accountable, real change becomes possible. I believe this renewed civic energy can help build a stronger, fairer Legislature, one that puts the needs of everyday Mainers ahead of politics and special interests.

Inside this report, you'll find additional highlights from the session. Please note that the general effective date for non-emergency laws passed during the First Special Session of the 132nd Legislature was Wednesday, September 24, 2025.

As always, I welcome your questions, concerns, and feedback. It is an honor to represent you, and I'm deeply grateful for the continued trust and support of the people in our district.

Growing Tax Burden for Maine

State Budget Grows 10% For the Next Two Years

Despite opposition from the House Republican Caucus, Maine's 2025 budget introduced several tax hikes. These included a \$1.50 per pack increase in the tobacco tax, a new 5.5% sales tax on streaming services like Netflix and Spotify, and a cannabis tax hike from 10% to 14%. Seniors will also face new taxes on private pensions, projected to cost them \$30 million over two years.

The Legislature enacted a new biennial budget totaling \$11.6 billion for fiscal years 2026–2027, following a series of party-line votes. This marks a 10% increase over the previous \$10.5 billion budget for FY 24/25. For historical context, Maine's state budget for FY 16/17 was approximately \$6.7 billion, highlighting the state's steadily growing expenditures over the past decade.

High-Profile Bills Awaiting Action by the Governor


- Among the high-profile bills awaiting a decision by the Governor in January, 2026 include:
- **Internet Gaming:** Would provide the Wabanaki Nations exclusive rights to operate online gaming in Maine.
 - **Immigration Enforcement:** Prohibits local officials from cooperating with federal immigration enforcement agencies.
 - **Ghost Guns:** Requires serial numbers for untraceable firearms.
 - **Education:** Adds Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander history to school curricula.
 - **Environmental Safety:** Establishes a statewide system to safely dispose of firefighting foam containing harmful "forever chemicals."

Voters to Decide on Voter ID & Firearms Access Initiatives

Two citizen-initiated statutes are heading to the Nov. 4, 2025 ballot. Both initiatives, one requiring voter photo ID and another establishing risk protection orders to restrict firearms access, met the signature requirement of 67,682 valid signatures. Under Maine's indirect initiative process, the Legislature had the option to act but took no vote, sending both measures directly to voters.

Is the State Holding Your Money?

The Maine Treasurer's Office is currently safeguarding \$359 million in unclaimed property and financial assets that rightfully belong to Mainers.

Each year, thousands of businesses and organizations turn over unclaimed financial assets to the state. These include forgotten bank accounts, uncashed checks, insurance payouts, and even contents of safety deposit boxes. If the rightful owner cannot be located after a period of inactivity, these assets are transferred to the Treasurer's Office.

In 2024, Maine's Unclaimed Property Program received \$65.4 million in unclaimed funds and processed 60,384 claims, returning a total of \$28.4 million to rightful owners. The average claim amount was \$412, and the largest single claim paid to an individual was \$302,198. Currently, there are over 6 million unclaimed accounts available.

Independent Auditors' Report

To the Select Board

OPINIONS

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities and the aggregate remaining fund information of Town of Kenduskeag, Maine, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine, as of December 31, 2025, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

BASIS FOR OPINIONS

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's ability to continue as a going concern for twelve months beyond the financial statement date, including any currently known information that may raise substantial doubt shortly thereafter.

AUDITOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

REQUIRED SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis, schedule of changes in net OPEB liability and related ratios, and budgetary comparison schedule, on pages 5-9, 27, and 28 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Kenduskeag, Maine's basic financial statements. The combining nonmajor fund financial statements, schedule of property valuation, assessments, and appropriations, schedule of taxes receivable and schedule of departmental operations are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and related directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the combining nonmajor financial statements, schedule of property valuation, assessments, and appropriations, schedule of taxes receivable and schedule of departmental operations are fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.
